January 15, 2019

CALL TO ORDER – INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Hill called the regular meeting of the Redmond Committee for Art in Public Places (RCAPP) to order at 4:30 p.m., Tuesday, January 15, 2019, with a quorum of members present (8 of 9).

ACTION ITEMS

1. Vote for Chair and Vice-Chair

Chair Hill nominated a slate as Mr. Mooney, to serve as **Chair** and herself, Ms. Hill to serve as Vice Chair. Ms. Simmons moved to accept Mr. Mooney as Chair and Ms. Hill as Vice-Chair for calendar year 2019. Ms. Barker seconded the nomination. Mr. Mooney and Ms. Hill agreed to serve. Members voted unanimously (8/0/0) for Mr. Mooney as the 2019 Chair and Linda Gilmore Hill as 2019 Vice Chair.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Electrical Box Project-Out of the Box

Ms. Carter presented a request for members of her Girl Scout Troop to collaborate with RCAPP on the painting of an electrical box. Her troop is in the process of working on their Bronze Award and need to complete a "give back to the community" Take Action project. Ms. Carter has 8 students that would like to paint words of encouragement and positivity. Her Troop members are current students of Redmond schools, Sage Elementary, Tuck Elementary, John McCall Elementary and Redmond Proficiency Academy, and Terrebonne Elementary School. The project would need to be completed by 2019.

Ms Standerwick moved to table the electrical box project discussion to the February meeting to give staff time to research the cost per box for supplies, and artist fee. Ms Burton seconded the motion. Members voted unanimously (8/0/0).

2. Art Around the Clock 6

Ms. Hill provided an update on the Art Around the Clock 6 Request for Proposal that closed on January 10th, 2019. Submittals were scored on Tuesday, January 15, 2019. There were 133 total submittals received, 132 via Café Artist and 1 hard copy, 74 declined, 59 scored. 15 pieces were chosen for installation in June 2019.

3. Centennial Mural

Ms. Hill advised that staff had received notice from the property owner of 433 SW 5th Street with a request to remove the Centennial Mural on the east side of their building. The Centennial Mural was installed in 2010. The mural was an art project completed in conjunction with students from Redmond Proficiency Academy and an artist in residence and depicts the last 100 years of Redmond. The mural was painted on 8 pieces of wood and then attached to the east side of the building for display.

4. Event Planning – Update

Ms. Hill advised that the subcommittee submitted great ideas for events. Committee needs to continue discussing events moving forward, specific issues with events are lack of man power, who do we do events for, fundraising, visibility/awareness. Mr. Taylor suggested that any events that the committee organizes should be consistent with the name of “public art”. Ms. Hill suggested that further discussion will need to take place at the February meeting. Ms. Burton suggested partnering with another event in downtown Redmond. Mr. Mooney added that he likes events but that this committee would need the right event in order to move forward.

5. Skate Park and Pump Track Mural

Subcommittee team of Mr. Mooney, Mr. Taylor, and Mr. Stelzer will meet and discuss how to involve the local business owners of the Redmond Snow and Skate Shop and Trinity Bikes and community members that access those parks on the design phase and implementation of the mural projects at the Redmond Skate Park and Redmond Pump Track.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Jim Erickson, Volunteer with Deschutes County Fairgrounds; presented an art donation that was created by the community during the 4-day event, 2018 Deschutes County Fair, created at Maker’s Way. The metal art piece started with a 6’ metal frame, each community member came up, picked a piece of metal and directed welder, Elizabeth Oliver or artist, Lee Barker on where they wanted their piece added to the structure. 300 community members participated in the sculpture. Ms. Hill requested a chance for the committee to view the piece in person. Mr. Erickson offered time the following day. Committee will discuss the donation at the next scheduled meeting.

COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS

Reminder: Chair Hill reminded members to attend the annual Committee/Commission Meeting and Ethics Training on January 28th, 2019 at 5:30pm, City Hall Civic Room 208.

Oregon Winterfest will take place February 15-17, 2019. Mr. Mooney will be attending as a judge. The winning fire pit will be installed in Redmond.
