**MINUTES**

**August 20, 2019**

Redmond City Hall – Room 207, 411 SW 9<sup>th</sup> Street, Redmond, Oregon

**CALL TO ORDER – INTRODUCTIONS**

Chair Mooney called the regular meeting of the Redmond Committee for Art in Public Places (RCAPP) to order at 4:28 p.m., Tuesday, August 20, 2019, with a quorum present 8 of 9 members).

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A. June 18, 2019

Ms. Hill requested correcting “Wyndemere” to “Windermere” in two places on the June 18, 2019, minutes: DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS, Agenda Item B, Paragraphs 1 and 2.

**Motion 1** (8/0/0): Vice-Chair Hill moved to approve the minutes from the meeting of June 18, 2019, as amended. Ms. Harris seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

**DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS**

A. Community Conversation – Redmond Comprehensive Plan Update 2040

Mr. Roberts outlined the City’s comprehensive plan review process and presented a handout – “Redmond 2040: A Community Snapshot.”

Committee members provided feedback on five questions:

**1. Why did/do you choose to live and/or work in Redmond? What do you cherish most about this community?**

Size (small enough to meet people you know), friendly, City Council does a great job keeping a family-oriented focus when deciding what to do and where we’re going, more homogenous/cohesive than Bend, music and art (concerts, activities), individuals and small groups can still effect change, feel safe in my neighborhood, good parks (Sam Johnson Park is an iconic draw for new residents), better traffic flow than Bend, access to outdoor activities.

**2. What do you want to see in the Redmond of 2040?**

Roads maintained, better traffic management, downtown core (expand beyond 2-3 blocks, increase density, pedestrian-oriented, destination), expand trail system for bikes and pedestrians, dedicate bike lanes separate from motor vehicle traffic (feels safer for riders), public transit system, bike-sharing system, reduce homeless population (improve public safety), better trail connectivity, save/upgrade old Evergreen Gym (art cooperative, other productive purpose, historical grant funds), finish Highway 97 bypass, activity center for kids (night), preserve and designate parks/open space, keep Redmond and Bend separate.

**4. In 2040, what would you tell a potential new resident about Redmond?**

Family town (parks, open spaces, good schools, bike-friendly), access to a good airport, good traffic flow.

**5. Other concerns:**

Innovative, long-term art planning integral to the development process (not “plop art” as an afterthought), creating dynamic places that people take pride in (new resident draw, involve students in design), sustainability (more “green” building), integrated housing (include affordable options in high-end developments, avoid slum-level housing), noise of airplanes taking off and landing over Eagle Crest.

RCAPP members thanked Mr. Roberts for soliciting input from a variety of sources on Redmond’s growth and development over the next 20 years.

**B. Tunnel Mural Issues**

Ms. Abslag presented color photos of tagging (graffiti) done on the most recent tunnel mural. She has discussed this problem with Parks Manager Annie McVay.

RCAPP discussion of potential solutions included adding security cameras, Mr. Stelzer and Redmond Proficiency Academy students discussing their recent tunnel painting project on a Bend-based community radio station, using RCAPP’s Facebook page to “police” tagging issues, closing the tunnel dusk to dawn, painting the walls in a dark gray color, painting the tunnel ceiling only, using a different mural design with less open space, stenciling a “happy face” over each “tag,” and giving up on the tunnel and painting a new mural in a more publicly visible place.

Ms. Abslag said she was awaiting update of Redmond’s mural code.

**C. Art Around the Clock Round 6 – Update**

Ms. Abslag presented color photos of artworks installed in AATC Round 6. She recommended updating the brochure and updating the RCAPP wall at Redmond Municipal Airport. She will add new QR codes to Round 6 pieces on August 21, 2019.

RCAPP discussion covered receiving more positive comments from the public about the Round 6 artworks, visitor tours of artworks, printing more greeting cards (check cost), and including the “fish” at the airport in the permanent art collection brochure.

**CITIZEN COMMENTS**

Ms. Snider discussed events planned by the Dry Canyon Arts Association including a pop-up art show downtown on weekends after Thanksgiving and before Christmas 2019.

None.
